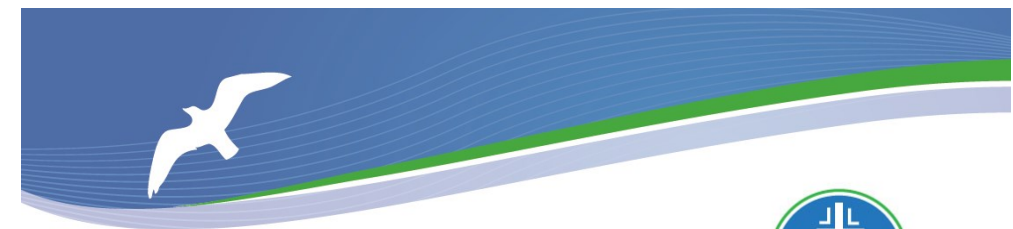

The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

The Kingdom of God or Reign of God is the number 1 subject of Jesus in the Gospels. It is THE priority! "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you."

Remember that Matthew uses the term Kingdom of Heaven so that his audience will understand the concept better. We have already covered parables which have given us hints about what Jesus means when he speaks of the Kingdom of God. It is characterized by a harvest of miraculous abundance and incredible joy, it has value greater than all our processions and there is no reason for us to wonder who is in and who is not since that is entirely God's decision.

Today we see the central place of forgiveness in the Kingdom.
