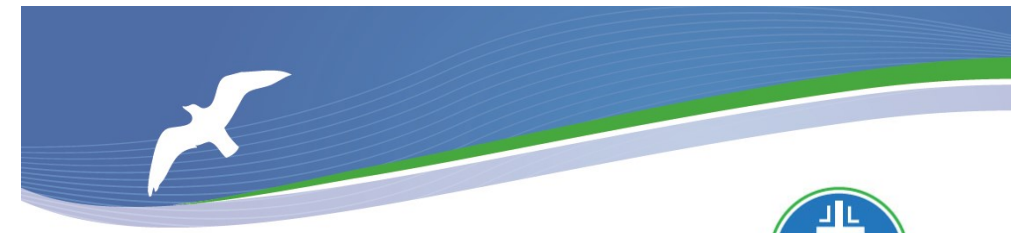

Into Uncharted Territory - God Leads Us

Mark 2:22 (Page 36 New Testament in Pew Bible)

This week we take our sermon series, "Into Uncharted Territory," into experimenting with new ways of being the church. This is not a declaration that the old way is bad. It is a matter of effectiveness. Why use old methods when they stop working? If we want to keep fulfilling our mission to build the kingdom by loving God, loving others and serving the world, we want to be effective. If you fish or know a person who fishes, you might have lots of different ways and lots of different bait to catch the fish you are trying to catch. If you garden or farm, you may plant some plants or trees that will bear fruit long after you are there, and you may not know how good the fruit will be until the fruit is ripe based on things outside your control. We explore and invest time in unknown paths all the time. Otherwise we would never find that next great fishing hole or the new perfect bait for an old one. In the United Methodist Church in Florida, we are calling this process Fresh Expressions. Fresh Expressions is a matter of sharing the gospel in a new context.
