Alleluia!

On Tuesday morning, September 4, at 10 a.m., the Embraer 110 departed the Agape hangar in Venice, FL, loaded with 2,926 pounds of cargo; including 24 water purification systems with spare parts, baseball equipment, and generators. At 12 p.m., the plane landed safely in Havana, Cuba, with a quick response from the Cuban Council of Churches: *Gloria a Dios!*

The next stop for the systems will be deliveries to five districts scattered across Cuba, a campground, and one to the Cuban Council of Churches along with a generator. The systems will be located on church grounds, but the clean, pure water is for the entire community. The baseball equipment will be used through *Ministero de Alcance Deportivo Misionero*.

We have been working on this project since our Alternative Christmas Market last December. Coronado has responded with such love and generosity that we not only are sending water systems to our eight sister churches but to two others, including the church pastored by Rev. Alexis Fernando who preached here last March.

The systems you purchased will be the first in the entire province of Las Tunas which has some of the worst water conditions in the country. This is also the first time one church has sent this many systems at one time. Thanks to you, families will have clean water easily available at no cost. Currently they rely heavily on bottled water.

We do not know the schedule for the delivery and installation of the systems. That is handled by the Bishop’s office in Havana. Our sister churches know they are coming – and they are excited and grateful. Thanks, Coronado, for serving God and sharing love!






- * **The Seekers Class** - *Aftermath* video series by Andy Stanley. This class meets in the Chapel.

Point of View and A Way Forward

The Bishop of the Florida Annual Conference, Ken Carter, has asked every congregation, including Coronado, to have healthy and honest conversations among its members about the various perspectives that we have on the LGBTQ topic and to use a standard curriculum that has been developed for every church in the state. It is called Point of View or POV, and we are inviting you to be a part of it. It is designed to give those of us with differing opinions on this and other subjects a chance to come together and talk.

I want to stress what POV is not about.

- ♦ It is NOT about your trying to convince another person to agree with your perspective.
- ♦ It is NOT about all of us coming to the same conclusion at the end.
- ♦ It is most certainly NOT about this church putting this topic up for a vote at the end of this experience.

But it is about doing the much harder work of listening to each other's perspectives and pains in a conversation that fosters empathy and understanding and healthy dialogue. Bishop Carter said "We are trying to create an alternative to the divisive spirit in our culture."

Please mark your calendar and try to be present for all three sessions in September (see invitation below). We will also schedule more sessions throughout the year. In preparation for the discussions, I suggest you might want to read *Anatomy of Peace*. 

Members of the Chancel Choir and the 11:00 a.m. Music Team will bring a dish for you to enjoy! This is for everyone (and their spouses) currently serving in the music ministry at Coronado as well as anyone who might be considering becoming a part of this vital ministry. This could be a great opportunity to meet others who are sharing their musical gifts, ask questions, get to know one another and of course, test out their best casserole dish in the process. Your dinner will be on us! We hope to see you there!



Here are some opportunities for you to serve in the music ministry at Coronado:

- * The **Adult Chancel Choir** provides music for the Sunday morning 9:30 a.m. Traditional Worship Service and for special seasonal programs. They rehearse on Wednesday evenings at 7 p.m. We are always excited for new singers, especially men and we hope you will consider singing with us. You can contact me or just walk in and surprise us. If you would like to sing for special programs, but not necessarily on a weekly basis, then you are welcome to stop in at 7:45 p.m. We will rehearse music for our Christmas Cantata from 7:45–8:30 p.m.
- * **Joyful Sound** is a group of women and men who will usually sing on the fourth Sunday of each month from November through April for the 8 a.m. Traditional Worship Service. They sing the anthem that the Chancel Choir will be singing at the 9:30 a.m. Service. If you would like to sing with this group, you could come to two rehearsals on Wednesday night before they would sing on the fourth Sunday. The time is from 7:15-7:40 p.m. The first rehearsal you will attend is on November 14.
- * **REFLECTIONS** is a women's vocal ensemble. They sing once a month from November through April for the Sunday morning 8 a.m. Traditional Worship Service and occasionally for the 9:30 a.m. Service. All women are welcome to be a part of this group. They will rehearse two Wednesdays and then be off for two Wednesdays. Their first rehearsal will be on November 7, from 6:30-7p.m.
- * **BAND OF BROTHERS** is a men's vocal ensemble. They sing once a month from November through April for the Sunday morning 8 a.m. Traditional Worship Service and occasionally for the 9:30 a.m. Service. All men are welcome to be a part of this group as well. They will rehearse for two Wednesdays and then be off for two Wednesdays. Their first rehearsal will be on October 24, from 6:30-7 p.m.
- * The **11 a.m. Music Team** provides music for the Sunday morning 11 a.m. Non-Traditional Worship Service. This is a praise and worship style of music. The team rehearses on Thursday evenings. Instrumentalists arrive at 6:15 p.m., and vocalists arrive at 6:45 p.m. Rehearsals are until 8 p.m. If you sing or play **any** instrument and enjoy this style of music, there is a place for you on this team. We would love for you to join us! Singers and instrumentalists in this group are generally scheduled on a rotation basis. If you think you might be interested, you can contact me and **we will work to accommodate your schedule.**
- * **Sonshine Kid's Choir** has begun rehearsals for the fall season. They meet on Monday evenings from 6:30-7 p.m. in the Music-Lecture Suite. Tosha Williams, the director of our Children's Summer Music Camp is directing the choir. All children through 6th grade are encouraged to join us for the fall season.

Audio Visual Volunteers Needed – We are looking for volunteers who would be able to sit in the A / V booth for their service once every month or two and change the screen as we sing our hymns/songs. Don't worry, we would show you how to do it. If this is something you might be able to help us with, speak with me or call the Church Ministries Office and leave a message.



BROCCOLI SALAD

1 lg. head broccoli, cut small
6 slices bacon, fried crisp and crumbled

1 c. grated Cheddar cheese
2 green onions, diced

Combine broccoli, bacon, cheddar cheese and green onions. Pour dressing over broccoli mixture. Marinate several hours before serving.

Dressing:

1 c. mayonnaise
½ c. sugar

¼ c. vinegar (white or cider)

Combine mayonnaise, sugar and vinegar, mixing well.

6 regular size Snickers bars or
18 fun size
½ c. chunky peanut butter
1 T. half & half (can use milk)

8 oz. Cool Whip, thawed
1 baked pie shell (or can use
graham cracker pie crust)

Using microwave, heat Snickers bars in glass mixing bowl until creamy. Try 1 minute and stir. If not creamy, continue heating at 15 second intervals, checking after each. (Be careful not to overheat. Otherwise, bars will be gluey instead of creamy.) Add peanut butter and half & half, stirring to combine well. Let cool slightly. Add Cool Whip and stir until thoroughly mixed. Pour into pie shell. Cover and refrigerate at least 8 hours. Can add additional Cool Whip with crumbled Snickers bar or crushed peanuts to top just before serving.




CorMeth Day School


